## About the activity

On their own or in small groups, your pupils can discover a series of underground tunnels. The tunnels vary in size and they have various tasks to carry out during their exploration. Completing the tasks will improve pupils' self-confidence, problem-solving skills and teamwork.

## Activity aims

### The aim of this activity is to:

- Allow each participant to experience tunnel trail.
- Ensure participants work together supporting and encouraging each other.
- Provide an opportunity for participants to discuss what they have accomplished.

## Progression opportunities

### Some participants may also:

- Demonstrate how to draw and use plans and diagrams confidently.
- Be confident in leading a group through the tunnels.
- Take the initiative in evaluating their performance and that of the group.
- Be able to assess risks and understand how these may be controlled.

### In addition, participants should also have developed in the following:

- Interpersonal communication
- Teamwork
- Confidence in unfamiliar surroundings
- Ability to work cooperatively with others

## Learning outcomes

### Upon completion of the activity, participants will have:

- Demonstrated the ability to listen to, understand and act on instructions received.
- An understanding of associated hazards.
- Used their senses to help explore an unfamiliar environment.
- Effectively worked and communicated in small teams supporting their peers throughout the activity and recognising their achievements.
- Contributed to a post activity review led by the instructor identifying what they did well and then suggested ways to improve.

## Associated vocabulary

<b>Words relevant to safety</b>	e.g. boundaries, hazards, personal protective equipment, risk assessment, rules.
<b>Words relevant to the activity</b>	e.g. confidence building, co-ordination, dark, imagination, light, problem solving, teamwork, claustrophobia.
<b>Words relevant to teamwork</b>	e.g. achievement, communication, encouragement, leadership, listening, participation, review, responsibility, support, trust.
<b>Words relevant to communication</b>	e.g. contribution, discussion, decision making, encouragement, instruction, listening, opinion, praise, support, understanding.
