You will teach with a focus on practise of communicative language, providing a stimulating, challenging and enjoyable learning experience for students.

Responsibilities

Deliver class programmes in line with PGL standards.

- Assist with, the placement tests for students on arrival, marking tests and placing students as required by the Director of Studies, ensuring classes meet the groups' ability level and objectives.
- Maximise the use of resources provided to deliver fun, interesting and informative lessons and ensure all resources are returned after each course.
- Manage the classroom effectively in terms of behaviour and discipline. Encourage and motivate the students in class.
- Ensure that all class paperwork is properly completed including daily records of work, student workbooks and student end of course reports.

- Work with individual guest's needs and engage other colleagues where necessary.
- Engage with students and Tour Leaders outside the classroom in an appropriate, professional manner.
